We hope this letter finds you and your family healthy and safe. This pandemic and the suffering it has created are unprecedented in our lifetime, but the past year has demonstrated the power and importance of an intimate and authentic community like Congregation Or Ami.

During this year, our community responded by saying “*Henaynu*,” we are here for one another. We began by calling every congregant, starting with our elders and most vulnerable, to check in and offer support. We then found innovative ways to transcend our separation with fun Holiday Drive Thru events, engaging Couch-Comfortable Holiday celebrations, meaningful Cocoa Conferences with our teens, and thought-provoking Or Ami Village gatherings.

Similarly, we have responded *Henaynu* to the individual needs of our partners. We have helped many within our community obtain masks, groceries, and medicine. Our team has helped set up technology, provide spiritual and emotional support, and arrange financial help to those most impacted by this pandemic. We have been honored to provide solace in online funerals and shiva minyans, as well as celebration at bris and baby namings, B'nai Mitzvah, and weddings.

We say *Henaynu* because we understand showing up for each other is at the center of what it means to be part of a Jewish community. We plan to be there, in the special way Congregation Or Ami always is. That's why Or Ami's community is the same size as last year; we ensured that everyone could continue as congregants.

We make this ask even as we know that this past year was a difficult one for many, including our congregation. We are still anticipating a decline in revenue, and we have trimmed our budget considerably to compensate. In addition, our clergy voluntarily limited their compensation. Still, annual partnership commitments cover the bulk of our operating expenses, and they are essential to enable us to serve the needs of our congregation and to provide the vital *Henaynu* support we always do.

We remain committed to welcoming every family regardless of their financial capacity.
